In a rescheduled dual, originally set for Dec. 18, Cedar Rapids Jefferson defeated Cedar Falls, 45-21, tonight (1/2).



In the premier match of the night, the J-Hawks' Jason McCormick was just as successful as his team as a whole. McCormick, ranked fourth, defeated the Tigers' third-ranked Aidan Brock, 8-2. According to Jefferson Coach Dick Briggs, McCormick scored a takedown between a pair of escapes in the second period after wrestling a scoreless first period. McCormick, who lost to Brock last season, broke open the match with an escape and then took Brock down to his back for the final five points.

It's a quirky situation. Ballard, Simley and Christiansburg all tied at 1-2. The current rules take the total matches won between the three teams and eliminates the third team. In this case, Christiansburg actually won the least matches of the three, leaving Ballard and Simley. Once it's pared down to two teams, the tiebreaker then switches to head-to-head results. Simley defeated Ballard, so they were awarded second place. I had a similar question and The Predicament's Wyatt Schultz explained the process.

I understand Ballard was not too happy about it, since they actually won more matches than Simley, but like I said, the criteria changes once the team with the lowest amount of wins is eliminated. Sounds like that procedure for breaking ties could change in the future.
